## **Professional Development Program**

The Professional Development Program (PDP) in the Center for Leadership Education is designed to help graduate and postdoctoral students succeed in both academic and professional settings. Recently, The Commission on Pathways Through Graduate School noted in their final report that more than one-half of all doctoral degree holders in science, engineering or health fields work outside the academy. In addition, a recent survey from LinkedIn reported that the top skills that employers look for are communication, leadership, project management, teamwork, and other interpersonal skills. The PDP Program offers a series of half-semester courses in topics such as technical communication, presentation skills, grant writing, managing people, leading teams, managing personal finances, consulting, and other relevant areas. Courses emphasize real-world, simulation-based experiences and are open to all full time graduate students (masters, doctoral, and postdoctoral fellows) at Johns Hopkins. These courses must be taken for a letter grade. A small but growing number of master's degree programs in the Whiting school (only) accept a limited number of these courses as elective credits.
